2 Recommendations

- Call Chinese people in Chinese way other than western style
- There are only 2 recommendations to call Chinese people during daily life
- ■Recommendation1: If only 2 Chinese characters, call family name+given name

Recommendation 2: If there are 3 Chinese characters, just call given name

Family name LI Given name Xinhui









Call Chinese name in formal way(meeting/conference)

Whatever 2 or 3 characters, call full name: family name+given name



Call Chinese nick title in a respectful way

Sometime, Doctor (or VP) got special respectful name



Recommendation to Chinese

- Depends on whether you would like western people call you in western way or Chinese way
- •If in Chinese way, we need to capitalize our last name in order to help western people better understand

Backup

4 tones

- •Even is 1,
- •rising is 2, down then
- •up is 3, and
- •falling is 4. Thus, a name such as "DENG" might be written as "DENG4" to indicate a rising tone.
